Focus on creating and sustaining inclusion in the mining professions

The Society for Mining, Metallurgy & Exploration Inc. (SME) is a cosponsor of the first Diversity in the Minerals, Metals and Materials Professions Summit. Hosted by The Minerals, Metals and Materials Society (TMS), the conference will be held at the National Academy of Sciences in Washington, D.C., July 29-31. The summit will feature presentations and workshops tailored for professionals from industry, government and academia that focus on key insights and best practices for improving diversity and inclusion within each sector.

- Professionals in government, industry and academia.
- Human resources and diversity officers in science and engineering organizations.

Working sessions led by professional facilitators will identify challenges, strategies, resources and recommendations for creating and sustaining diversity. Panel discussions and working sessions incorporate inclusion training and leadership skills. Designed for early- to mid-career professionals, the opportunity to network with nearly 300 scientists and engineers enhances the value of the conference. In addition, a final report and diversity toolkit will be developed and made available online by fall 2014.

The summit banquet July 29 will honor the legacy of Ellen Swallow Richards, the first female member of the American Institute of Mining & Petroleum Engineers (AIME). Ms. Richards was a pioneer in applying science to improve community health and safety, and a founder of the ecology movement. The first Ellen Swallow Richards Diversity Award will be presented during the banquet.
